Guiding Principles for Health Care Reform in Iowa:

- 1. Quality health care is a basic human right, not a privilege to which only some groups of people have access.
- 2. We all share a common responsibility to ensure that families have the quality health care they need, when they need it, at a fair and reasonable cost.
- 3. Health care coverage should be seamless, accessible, and portable, including for all people with "pre-existing" conditions.
- 4. Health care coverage must include the prevention, treatment, and management of illness and disease, as well as the preservation of mental and physical well-being, through services for all Iowans offered by health professionals. All reforms must include prescription drug coverage, access to acute care services, the prevention and treatment of substance abuse, mental health treatment, access to wellness programs, and long-term care in one's community.
- 5. All health care reforms must move us toward the goal of health care for all.
- 6. The costs of health care coverage should be determined by ability to pay.
- 7. There should be effective health reforms tailored to the specific needs of children, immigrants, people with disabilities, refugees, minorities, and farm families.
- 8. Health care coverage and the delivery of health care services must be simple to understand and easy to use.
- 9. Health care reforms should always broaden "risk pools," to include all individuals regardless of health status.
- 10. Health care decisions should be made by the individual and his or her health care professionals.
